Proposal by Kuwait

Article 11A

Insert a new article, immediately after article 11, to read either:

- A request for the extradition of an alleged offender, pursuant to this Convention, shall not be granted if the requested State Party has substantial grounds for believing:
 - that the request for extradition for an offence set forth in article 3 has been made for the purpose of prosecuting or punishing a person on account of his race, religion, nationality, ethnic origin or political opinion; or
 - that the person's position may be prejudiced:
 - (i) for any of the reasons mentioned in subparagraph (a) of this paragraph, or
 - (ii) for the reasons that communication with him by the appropriate authorities of the State entitled to exercise rights or protection can not be effected. $\frac{1}{2}$

Article 9, the International Convention Against the Taking of Hostages (1979). 1/

or as follows:

Nothing in this Convention shall be interpreted as imposing an obligation to extradite if the requested State has substantial grounds for believing that the request for extradition for an offence mentioned in article 3 has been made for the purpose of prosecuting or punishing a person on account of his race, religion, nationality or political opinion, or that the person's position may be prejudiced for any of these reasons. 2/
