THE ASSEMBLY,

RECALLING Part IV, Article 16, paragraph (h) of the IMCO Convention concerning the functions of the Assembly, and Part XIII of the same Convention relating to Legal Capacity, Privileges and Immunities of the Organization,

FURTHER RECALLING that the Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the Specialized Agencies, adopted on 21 November 1947 by the General Assembly of the United Nations, was modified by its Annex XII to have special reference to IMCO and that the Convention as modified was accepted by the First Assembly in its Resolution A.10(I),

NOTING that the Second Assembly of the Organization adopted on 11 April 1961 Resolution A.25(II) recommending that members of the Assembly not having done so apply to IMCO the provisions of the Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the Specialized Agencies including its Annex XII,

HAVING CONSIDERED the Report of the Secretary-General (A.III/10),

RECOMMENDS that Member States which have not yet notified their willingness to do so should apply to IMCO without reservation the provisions of the Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the Specialized Agencies including its Annex XII.
