

Communication from the Secretary-General to Member States' Representatives (Updated version - 28 June 2024)

- This document provides an update on the situation in the Red Sea region as of 28 June 2024. It has been prepared by the IMO Secretariat.
- 2 Since 19 November 2023, the IMO Secretariat has recorded 53 incidents, including acts of piracy against international shipping vessels transiting the Red Sea and Gulf of Aden.
- 3 The Secretary-General submits a monthly report to the UN Security Council in accordance with Resolution S/RES/2722(2024). The report provided to the Security Council includes only a table of the various attacks (in a format similar to annex 1 of this document) for cases identified since 10 January 2024, date on which the resolution was adopted.
- The UN Security Council adopted on 27 June Resolution S/RES/2739(2024) extending resolution 2722 until 15 January 2025.
- 5 The cases listed in Annex 1 of this document meet three criteria:
 - 1. An attack is reported on a vessel specifically identified by a navy, media or coastal state, and
 - 2. The attack on this particular vessel is publicly claimed by the Houthis, and
 - 3. The attack is confirmed by the flag state or the company.

If one of these three criteria is not met, the case is not listed.






Figure 1. Incidents since 10 January.

These attacks concerned the following types of vessels:




Figure 2. Incidents by Type of Vessel.

The distribution of these incidents over time is as follows:




Figure 3. Distribution incidents over time. *(until 28 June)
