**Communication from the Secretary-General to Member States' Representatives  
(Updated version – 11 September 2024)**

1 This document provides an update on the situation in the Red Sea region as of 11 September 2024. It has been prepared by the IMO Secretariat.

2 Since 19 November 2023, the IMO Secretariat has recorded 67 incidents confirmed by Flag States, including acts of piracy against international shipping vessels transiting the Red Sea and Gulf of Aden.

3 The Secretary-General submits a monthly report to the UN Security Council in accordance with Resolution S/RES/2722(2024). The report provided to the UN Security Council includes only a table of the various attacks (in a format similar to annex 1 of this document) for cases identified since 10 January 2024, date on which the resolution was adopted.

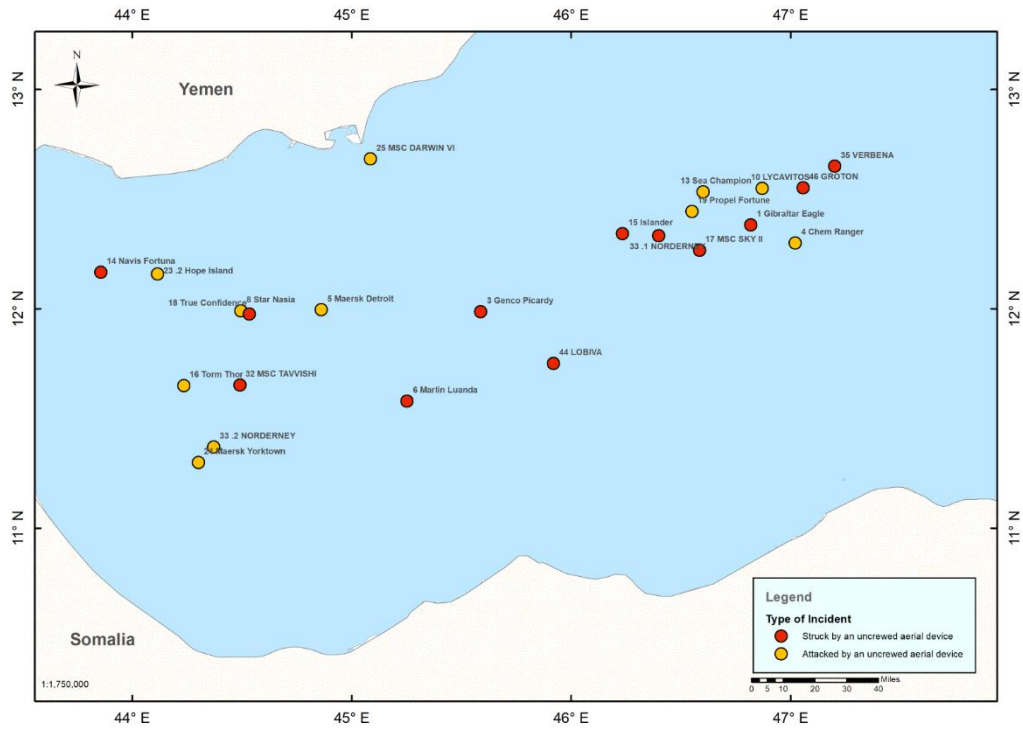
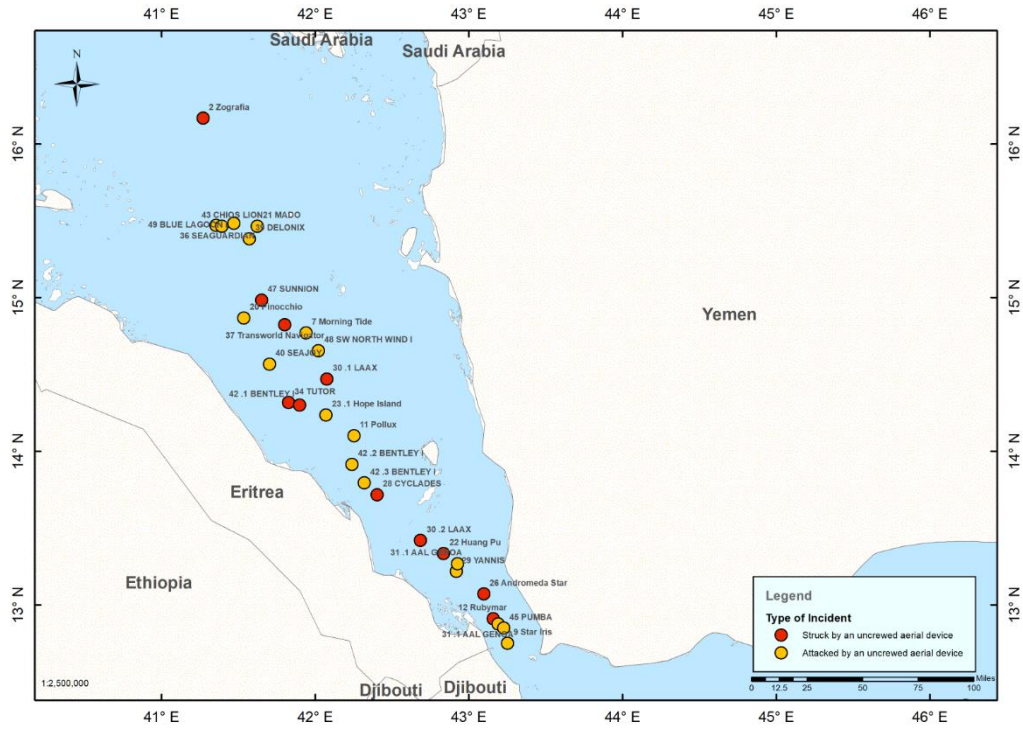
4 The UN Security Council adopted on 27 June 2024, Resolution S/RES/2739(2024) extending resolution 2722 until 15 January 2025.

5 The cases reported to the UN Security Council meet three criteria:

1. An attack is reported on a vessel specifically identified by a navy, media or coastal state, and
2. The attack on this particular vessel is publicly claimed by the Houthis, and
3. The attack is confirmed by the flag state or the company.

If one of these three criteria is not met, the case is not listed.

6 Since November 2023, the Houthis have publicly claimed responsibility for all cases, but recently several attacks confirmed by navies and the flag State, with modus operandi totally similar to the other attacks, have not been claimed by the Houthis. These cases will now be presented in the context of this report with the explicit mention that no claim has been made by the Houthis.



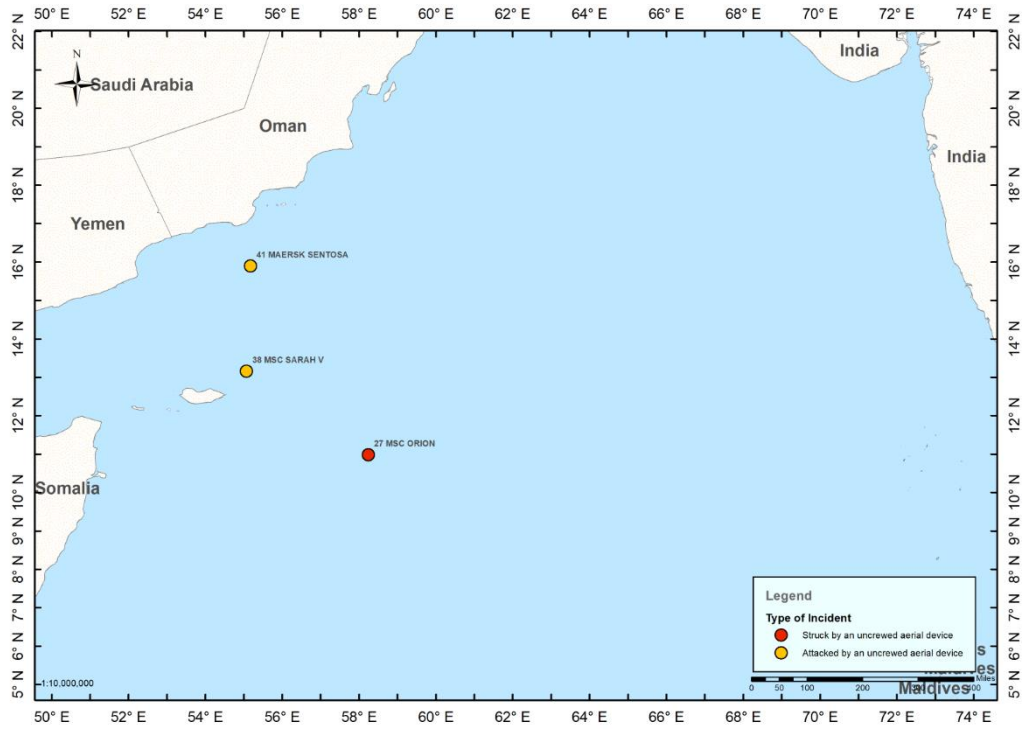


Figure 1. Incidents since 10 January.

These attacks concerned the following types of vessels:

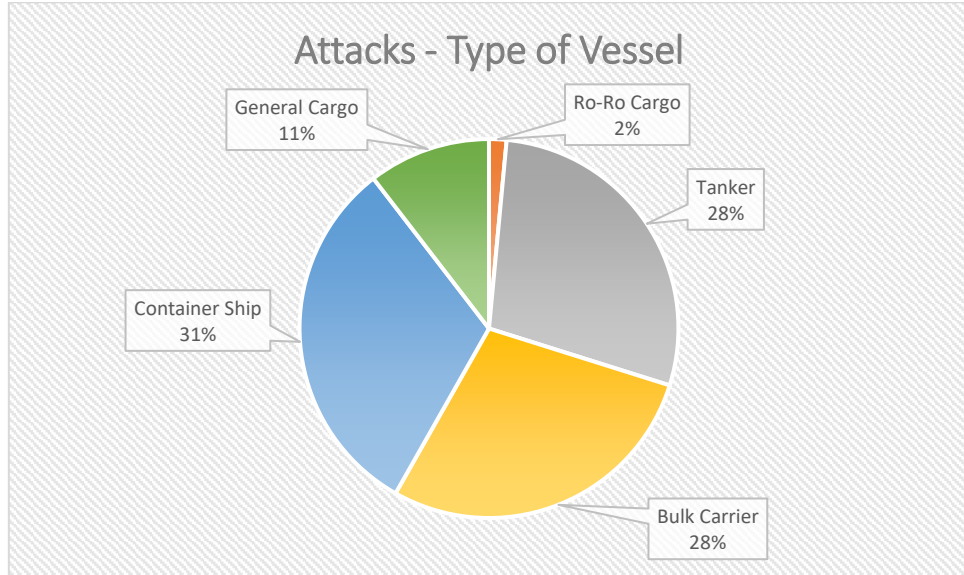


Figure 2. Incidents by Type of Vessel.

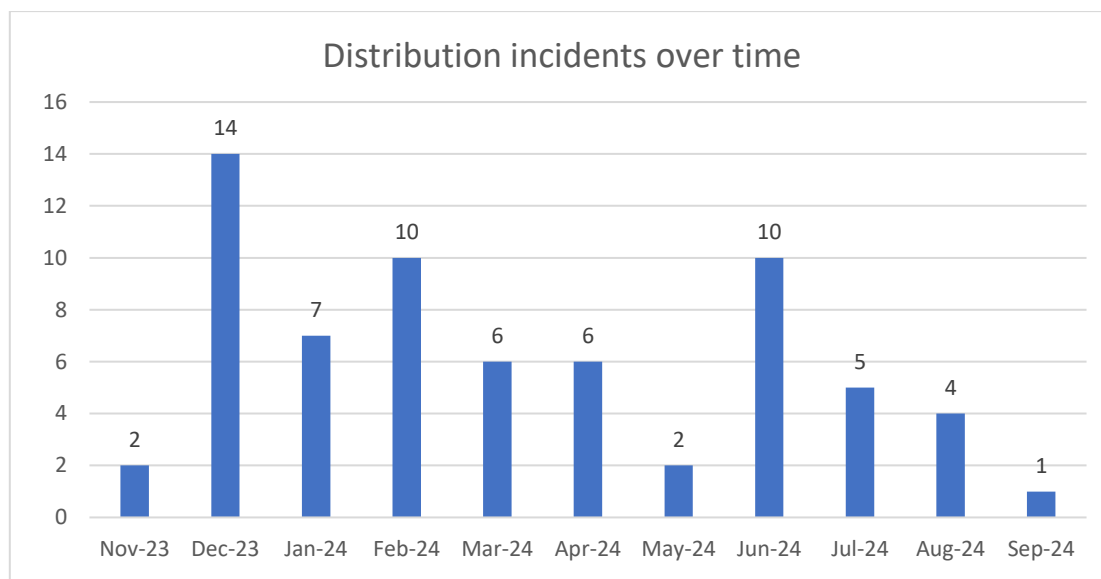





Figure 3. Distribution incidents over time. \*(until 28 June)


