## A safe and environmentally sound approach to ship recycling

Cosponsored by the Governments of Norway and Pakistan, and the International Maritime Organization (IMO)

The entry into force of the International Hong Kong Convention for the safe and environmentally sound recycling of ships in June 2025 represents an important milestone for the sustainability of our oceans and coastal livelihoods. The Convention is aimed at ensuring that ships, when being recycled after reaching the end of their operational lives, do not pose any unnecessary risks to human health, safety and to the environment.

The event will host a conversation about how environmentally sustainable ship recycling and hazardous waste management are possible, and the experience, achievements and challenges faced by governments and industry in developing countries when adopting measures and enforcing best practice standards.
