

Duration of the standard programme: 14 months

Entry requirements: A candidate should:

- be established in a career in the maritime field
- hold:
 - a Bachelor's degree, or
 - the highest grade certificate of competency for unrestricted service as master mariner or chief engineer, or equivalent maritime qualification and have substantial, directly relevant professional experience
- have competence in English language, demonstrated by an internationally recognised standard test
- have computer competence (at least the ability to use Microsoft Office)



Application procedure:

- All candidates must apply online
- Applications can be submitted at any time; there are no cut-off dates

Fees and living costs:

- The fee for entrants to the Class of 2025 is USD 28,600
- Living costs at least SEK 12,000 (that is around 1,100 USD) per month

Financial support:

- One third of students are funded by their own companies, governments or national funding agencies
- Fellowships are available



Fellowships / Scholarships

Procedure of applying for fellowships:

- The application for donor funding must be made by an employer of the prospective student, who completes the Application for Financial Support form, available on the WMU website
- To be considered for certain donor fellowships, applicants must complete additional motivational statements to be submitted together with their applications
- Some donors have established criteria that are used when considering applicants

Highly competitive!

At least six well-qualified applicants for each fellowship.


