

## Communication from the Secretary-General to Member States' Representatives (Updated version - 8 May 2024)

- 1 This document provides an update on the situation in the Red Sea region as 8 May 2024. It has been prepared by the IMO Secretariat.
- 2 Since 19 November 2023, the IMO Secretariat has recorded 43 incidents, including acts of piracy against international shipping vessels transiting the Red Sea and Gulf of Aden.
- 3 The Secretary-General submits a monthly report to the UN Security Council in accordance with Resolution S/RES/2722(2024).

- 4 On the 18 February the **M/V RUBYMAR** (9138898), a cargo ship carrying 41,000 tons of fertilizer, 200 MT of Heavy Fuel Oil and 90 MT of Marine Diesel was struck by uncrewed aerial device. It was reported to have leaked oil, creating an 18-mile-long oil slick in the Red Sea, and with the crew abandoning ship. The ship subsequently sank on 2 March 2024.
- 5 On 6 March 2024, the bulk carrier vessel **M/V True Confidence** (IMO 9460784) was attacked at 54 nautical miles southwest of Aden. The attack resulted in the tragic loss of three crew members, with four others sustaining injuries, three of whom are in critical condition. The attack caused significant damage to the ship, prompting the crew to abandon it shortly after the attack. At the time of the attack, the vessel was manned by a crew of 20 individuals, supplemented by three armed guards. The crew composition included 15 Filipinos, four Vietnamese and one Indian, while the armed guards consisted of two Sri Lankans and one Nepali. Among the fatalities were two Filipinos and one Vietnamese national.
- 6 On 12 March, the Bangladesh-flagged bulk carrier **M/V Abdullah** (IMO 9745598) was reported under attack by 22 armed assailants from two craft at approximately 425nm east of Mogadishu, Somalia. All 23 crew members are Bangladeshi. The vessel was sailing from Mozambique's capital Maputo to the United Arab Emirates carrying cargo coal when it was attacked. On 14 April, the ship along with her crew were released.
- 7 On 26 April, the Portuguese flagged container vessel **MSC Orion** (IMO 9857157) was struck in the Indian Ocean by an uncrewed aerial device found lying on the deck of the vessel with no injuries or significant damage reported. This is the first attack to take place at such a distance from the Red Sea and the Gulf of Aden.

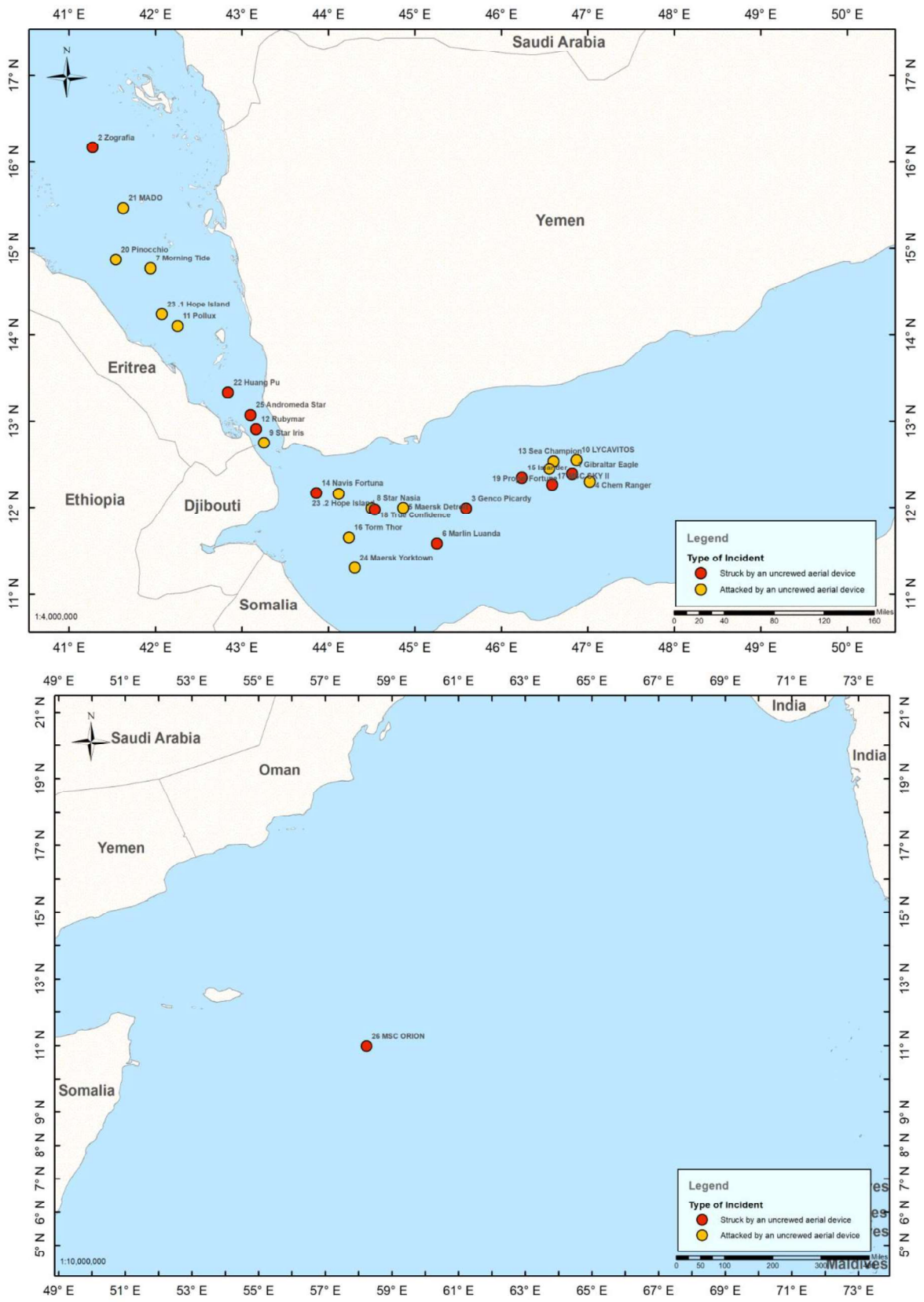


Figure 1. Incidents since 10 January.

These attacks concerned the following types of vessels:

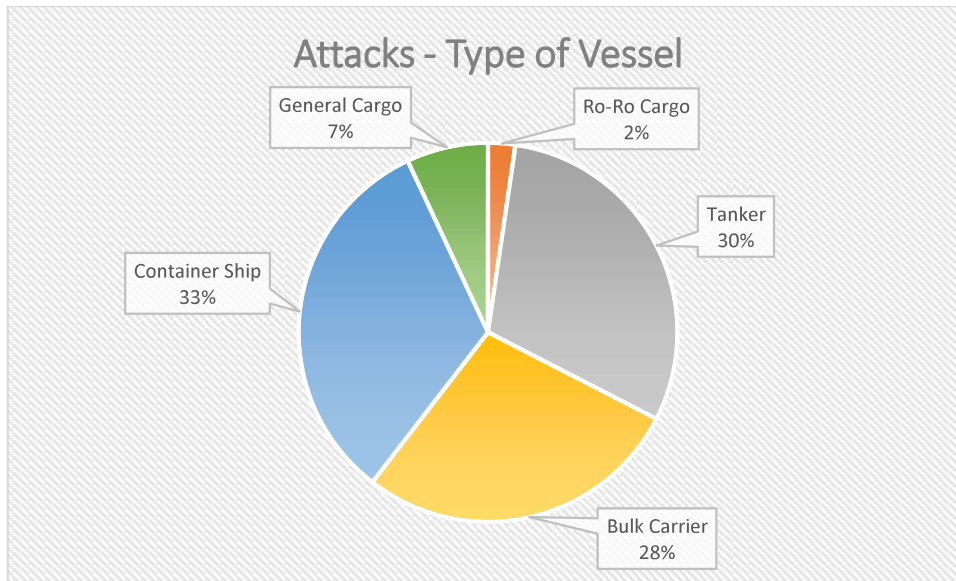


Figure 2. Incidents by Type of Vessel.

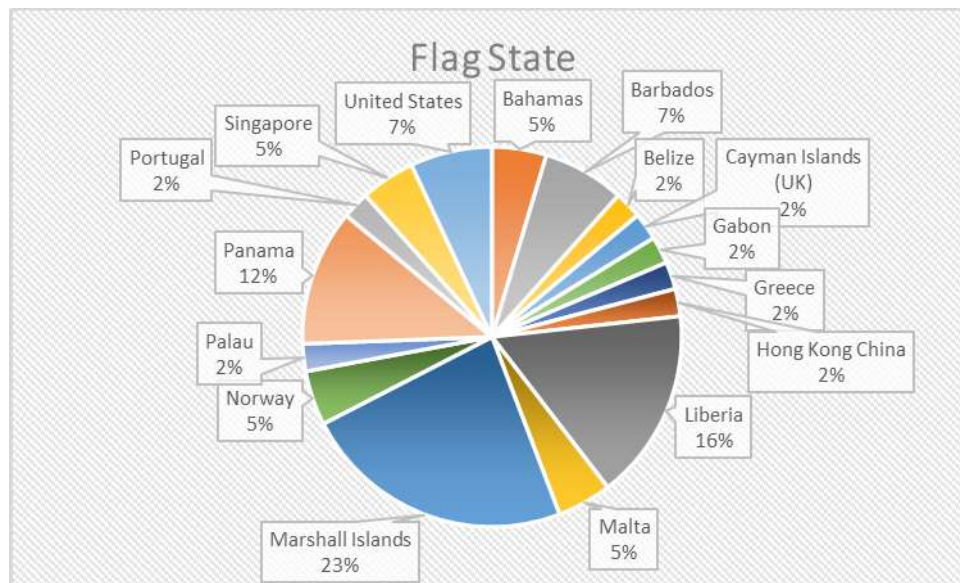


Figure 2. Incidents by Flag State

The distribution of these incidents over time is as follows:

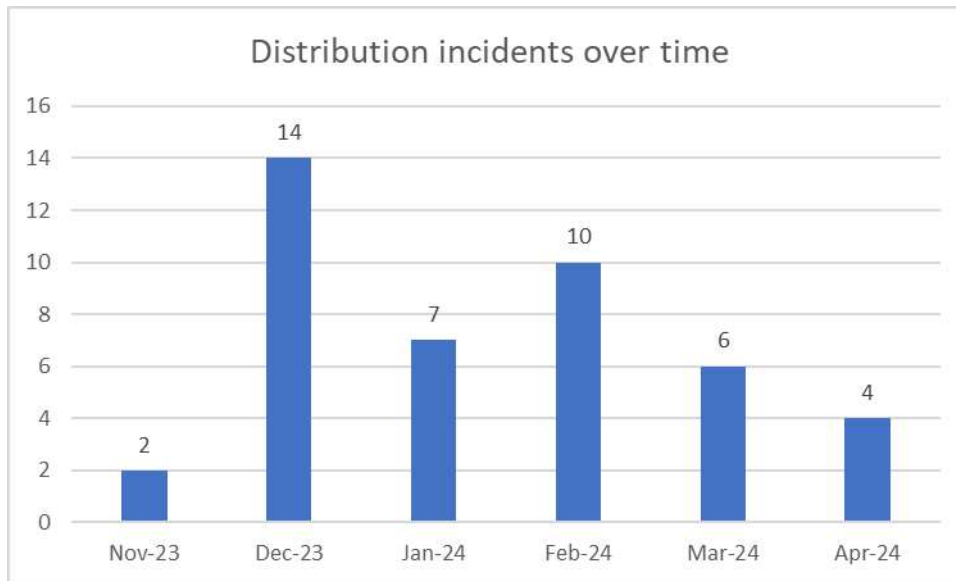





Figure 3. Distribution incidents over time. \*(until 8 May)
