Contract information:

This is an unpaid position for an externship open to students who are looking to expand their experience in research work within a multilateral and maritime context. There shall be no expectation of contract change or renewal at the end of this assignment.

In order to apply for this position, the university in which the student is enrolled must have a pre-existing mandatory or elective option for practical experience as part of its degree requirements. The extern is personally responsible for obtaining the necessary visa. No living or travel expenses will be paid by the Organization.

Purpose of the Post:

The overall objective of this assignment is to support the work of the External Relations Office in particular with research focused assignments on IMO's headquarters agreement with the host government; the establishment of Permanent Missions to the organization both in the UK and abroad, and the application of domestic laws across the UN system.

This would include: analysis of IMO's headquarters agreement; research on policies and procedures of international organizations and UN Offices in Europe and liaison with officials from IMO's Member States and across the UN system.

The work will also involve working with a number of colleagues in a multicultural environment.

Required competencies:

- a) Thoroughness and excellent attention to detail in all responsibilities, ensuring consistency in delivery and implementation;
- b) Training and or experience in law desired;
- c) Skills in legal research, analysis and drafting, demonstrated ability to work independently; and
- d) Effective working relationships with internal and external stakeholders, at all levels.

Specific academic and professional experience:

Students of law, international relations, diplomacy. Experience within the framework of the United Nations system or an international organization would be an advantage.

Language Skills:

Complete proficiency in English. Ability to draft clearly and concisely is essential. Knowledge of other official languages of the UN system, particularly French and/or Spanish, will be an asset.
