Contract information:

This is an unpaid position for an internship open to students who are looking to expand their experience in research work within a maritime context. There shall be no expectation of contract change or renewal at the end of this assignment. This post is only offered to candidates who have full legal eligibility to live and work in the UK.

In order to apply for this position, the university in which the student is enrolled must have a pre-existing mandatory or elective option for practical experience as part of its degree requirements. The student is personally responsible for obtaining the necessary visa. No living or travel expenses will be paid by the Organization.

Purpose of the Post:

The overall objective of this assignment is to support the work of the Public Information Services in particular with visual communications materials and photo databases. This would include: photo cataloguing; taking and editing photos which link to IMO's work; assisting with other visual tasks as required, including on the IMO public website; research on photo management tools.

The work will also involve working with a number of colleagues in a multicultural environment.

Required competencies:

- a) Thoroughness and excellent attention to detail in all responsibilities, ensuring consistency in delivery and implementation:
- b) Skills in photography, photo editing and demonstrated ability to work in an independent manner;
- c) Proficient with Photoshop; and
- d) Effective working relationships with internal and external stakeholders, at all levels.

Knowledge or demonstrable interest in maritime, environmental, seafaring and sustainability would be an advantage.
