The amendments were circulated as FAL. 6/Circ.9/Rev.1/Corr.1 dated 26 February 2002.
- 2 The Committee, at its thirtieth session (27 to 31 January 2003), endorsed the request of the Working Group on Ship/Port Interface (SPI) to delete the work programme item "Updating of the bibliography" from its work programme and instructed the Secretariat to continue updating the list (FAL. 6/Circ.9/Rev.1 and Corr.1).
- 3 Annexed* to this circular is a revised list, which incorporates the above-mentioned amendments and updated information received from relevant organizations, and on IMO publications from the previous list.
- 4 Member Governments and international organizations are invited to bring this list to the attention of all parties concerned and, in particular, port and terminal authorities.
- 5 The organizations whose publications are listed in this circular are requested to review the publications and inform the Secretariat on any publications, which are no longer available, or which are out-of-date; as well as of any which, in their view, should be added to the list.
- 6 This circular replaces FAL. 6/Circ.9/Rev.1 and Corr.1, dated 26 July 2001 and 26 February 2002 respectively.
