COMMENTS RECEIVED ON THE CHAIR'S PROPOSALS FOR ACTION

1 AGENDA ITEM 11 – UNSAFE MIXED MIGRATION BY SEA

Australia:

- notes the UN Refugee Agency's (UNHCR) initiative to reconstitute the Inter-Agency Group on Safety of Life at Sea;
- notes the discussions in MSC regarding the adoption of a new resolution to reiterate the importance of effective and timely involvement of Governments in cases of rescue of migrants at sea by merchant ships; and
- agrees to extend the target completion year of output 5.13 "IMO's contribution to addressing unsafe mixed migration by sea" to 2023.

2 AGENDA ITEM 12 – CONSIDERATION AND ANALYSIS OF REPORTS AND INFORMATION ON PERSONS RESCUED AT SEA AND STOWAWAYS

Australia:

- notes the information on the number of reports of incidents and the stowaways involved;
- supports urging Member States and international organizations to provide timely and accurate information on stowaway cases to IMO in accordance with standard 4.7.1 of the FAL Convention;
- invites the P&I Clubs to present information on stowaway cases;
- notes the number of reports on persons rescued at sea entered in GISIS since 2015; and
- notes the low level of reporting of migrant incidents at sea and of suspected smugglers and vessels and encourages Member States to provide and update the information in GISIS.

3 AGENDA ITEM 18 – TECHNICAL COOPERATION ACTIVITIES RELATED TO FACILITATION OF MARITIME TRAFFIC

Australia:

- notes the status of activities relevant to the implementation of the Facilitation Convention, conducted under the Integrated Technical Cooperation Programme in the period from December 2019 to December 2021; and
- agrees to urge Member States and the maritime industry to contribute to IMO's technical cooperation programme.

4 AGENDA ITEM 19 – RELATIONS WITH OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

Australia:

 notes the FAL Committee noted the relevant decisions of A 32, C 124 and C/ES.34 with regard to relations with non-governmental organizations, applications for consultative status and related matters.
